The mythical, small town of Grover's Corners is visited in three acts, narrated by a stage manager and depicts the simple daily lives of the people who live there.

In our town we explore the connections between the cosmic, universal truths of life and the importance of each individual moment we live.

Grover's Corners, New Hampshire.

Act I: May 7, 1901.

Act II: July 7, 1904.

Act III: August 29, 1913.

The full production runs 2 hours and 15 minutes including two intermissions. The first intermission is 15 minutes, the second is 10 minutes.

A Note From Our Director...

Our Town by Thornton Wilder is a play that many patrons have acted in, seen many times and maybe even watched as the 1940's movie starring William Holden.

When I decided to direct this piece, I wanted to make it my own and still give the audience a recollection of the play they knew and loved.

What we're bringing to the stage is a story, pure and simple, given to you, the audience as a gift to enjoy.

What I am not going to bring is an "awe shucks" story, not going to bring a "story about a time", or a story about "innocence" or a "love story" or a story about "loss" or a story "with a lesson".

My husband says my favorite saying is "stop fussing." So, I'm bringing this to you, without fuss, and invite you to share the joy of OUR Our Town.

A Note From Our Dramaturg...

Our Town, set in the small town of Grover's Corners and nestled in the early 20th century, unfolds a story of the interwoven lives of families and neighbours that has become an American classic with universal appeal. Thornton Wilder's most frequently performed play, appeared on Broadway in 1938 to wide acclaim, and won the Pulitzer Prize. It premiered during a time when the world was on the brink of tumultuous change and a second world war. Thornton Wilder's masterfully crafted narrative captures the essence of a bygone era, celebrating the ordinary moments that compose our existence as human beings.

The play's structure employs a unique metatheatrical style. The Stage Manager, serving both as narrator and observer, guides us through the traditionally minimalist stage. Wilder wrote that, "Our Town is an attempt to find a value above price for the smallest events in our daily life."

Our Theatre...

The Bernie Legge Theatre has been the home of the Vagabond Players for many, many decades. It started its life as a fishery, but after a few makeovers it has become a home for artists and theatre-lovers all around Greater Vancouver and the Fraser Valley.




manager, Rabbit Hole as Jason, and Haunting of Hill House as stage manager.

Players), Curious Incident




of the Dog in the Nighttime (WRPC), The Vagina Monologues (Peninsula Productions), Sylvia (Metro Vancouver) and many more.

Warren Johnson (Set Designer)


Warren wears many hats for Vagabond Players including President and Set Designer as well as set construction, set decorating, and in his spare time he is on the play reading committee.

Her first acting role was in a play called *A Good Man* and was honored with a





Goes, The Good Doctor, Sing A Song of Sixpence, and Move Over Mrs. Markham.


More recently, he appeared in The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde and Deathtrap with the Deep Cove Stage Society.
